Also, the eighth section was amended by striking out the word "to" in the second line thereof, and inserting the following: "when there is."

Mr. Giles moved to amend the twelfth section of said bill by striking out the word "January" in the sixth line, and inserting the word "July."

Mr. Martin moved as a substitute for said motion to insert "May."

On the question being put,

Will the house agree to substitute May for July?

It was determined in the negative.

Mr. Bowie then moved as a substitute for said motion to amend, to strike out all after the word "before" in the same line to the word "then," and insert "the time when the banks of Philadelphia shall resume;"

On the question being put, It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the motion of Mr. Giles to strike out "January" and insert "July."

When on motion of Mr. Constable,

Said motion was amended by adding thereto the following: "or ten days after the Banks of Philadelphia shall have resumed specie payments."

Mr. Bowie then moved to amend said motion as amended, by adding the following: "provided, that the banks of Philadelphia shall not resume until after the first day of July next."

On the question being put: Will the house agree to amend the said motion to amend?
