So the enacting clause was stricken out.

The house then took up for consideration the bill entitled, an act appointing a measurer of charcoal, and regulating the measuring of the same in the city of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Owens,

The word "a" in the 4th line of the 1st section was stricken out, and the word "two" inserted.

On motion of Mr. Risteau,

All after the word "Baltimore" in the 4th line of said section to the end thereof were stricken out, and the following inserted: "who before entering upon the duties of their office shall make oath or affirmation that they will truly and faithfully execute the duties of their office to the best of their knowledge and ability."

Mr. Bowie then moved to amend said section by striking out all from the word "Governor" in the 2nd line inclusive, to the word "on" in the 3d line, and inserting "Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall appoint;"

On the question being put—

It was determined in the negative.

The bill as amended was then put to the question on the passage, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Owens,

The title of the said bill was amended by striking out the word "a" and inserting the word "two."

The house then took up for consideration the bill entitled, an act for lessening the expenses of government.
