Mr. Risteau moved to amend said bill by adding as an additional section, "And be it further enacted that the said company shall provide a sufficient number of cars, and are hereby authorised and required to transport at the request of the owners of the soil, all articles which are used for the improvement of the same, such as lime, lime stone, wood and coal, and which the public convenience may require;"

Which was read.

Mr. Hammond moved to amend said amendment by inserting after the word "that" in the second line the following: "if at any time hereafter the legislature shall by law see fit so to require;"
