Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Gen. O. H. Williams the sum of two hundred and forty-three dollars, being the amount of supplies furnished the troops under the command of Captains Hollingsworth and Barnes, by sundry persons when on an expedition against the rioters on the line of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, to be paid over by the said Williams to the claimants;

Mr. Mason moved to amend the resolution from the said committee by adding thereto the following:

Resolved further, That the treasurer of the Western Shore pay to Gen. O. H. Williams or order, the sum of two dollars per day to all officers in the troops of Capts. Barnes and Hollingsworth; and to the private soldiers of said troops, one dollar per day, for each and every day which said individuals may have been engaged in suppressing the riots along the line of canal in September last, according to the list of names and days of service, which the said committee may make out and file with him, for his direction, provided that Gen. O. H. Williams give bond to the Treasurer, which shall be approved by him for the faithful appropriation of said sums of money.
