Mr. Byer submitted the following as a substitute for said report:

A bill entitled, an act to authorise a lottery to raise a sum of money to construct a turnpike road from Hagerstown, Washington county, through Leitersburg, to the Pennsylvania State Line, and for introducing wholesome water into the town of Leitersburg;

Which was read.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the said substitute?

Determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred on the passage of said bill, and on being put, it was passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Spence, from the committee on corporations, to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act for the incorporation of the Baltimore Manual Labor School for indigent boys, reported favorably thereon.
