Mr. Hellen asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to incorporate a Bank for the exclusive use of the tobacco planters, on the deposite of tobacco notes, to be named and styled the Tobacco Planters Bank of Maryland;

Referred to Messrs. Hellen, Bowie, Owens, Waters and Shaw.

Mr. Coad asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to condemn and lay off a road and lot of ground for a public landing, at Rich Neck in St. Mary's County;

Referred to Messrs. Coad, Shaw and Blakistone.

Mr. Bruce asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to pensions by county assessment, passed at December session, 1835, chapter 307, so far as the same relates to Charles county;

Referred to Messrs. Bruce, Bowling and Matthews.

Mr. Biser submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Armorer at Annapolis, be and he is hereby directed and required to deliver to Captain _____ or his order forty belts with clasps, upon bond being given by him to be approved by the Adjutant General;

Read the first and by special order the second time; assented to and sent to the senate.

Mr. Seidenstricker asked and obtained leave to introduce a bill, to provide for the introduction of pure and wholesome water in the city of Baltimore;

Referred to Messrs. Seidenstricker, Poultney and Welsh of B.

Mr. Martin asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, a supplement to an act, passed at December session, 1810, chapter 112, relating to Dover bridge in Talbot and Caroline counties;

Referred to the delegations of Talbot and Caroline counties.

On motion of Mr. Mason,

The house took up for consideration the resolution directing the Treasurer of the Western Shore to pay to Gen. O. H. Williams the sum of two hundred and forty-three dollars, being the amount of supplies furnished the troops under the command of captains Hollingsworth and Barnesley, sundry persons when on an expedition against the rioters on the line of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, to be paid over by the said Williams to the claimants.

The question being on the amendment moved by Mr. Mason, to the said resolution on the 9th instant.

Said amendment was amended by adding thereto the following: "the whole amount not to exceed \$300."
