

The said bill as amended was put to the question on its passage and passed.

The Speaker resumed the chair.

The house then took up for consideration the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the First Maryland Temperance Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

Read the second time and will pass.

The house then took up for consideration the following resolution submitted by Mr. Hook:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised and required to pay to the commissioners of tax for Baltimore county, or to their order, the sum of two hundred and twenty-two dollars, which said sum of money, the agents of said county have paid over and above its equal proportion of the colonization tax, and now claimed and demanded by said county, of the taxable inhabitants of Carroll county, and that Carroll county be and is hereby released from all such claims and demands;

Read the second time.

Mr. Spence moved to postpone the further consideration of said resolution until to-morrow.

On the question being put, It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the house assenting to said resolution.

Mr. Hook moved the previous question, and being demanded by a majority of the members present, the main question was then put, will the house assent to the said resolution?

Determined in the negative.

The house then took up for consideration the bill entitled, an act to authorise Josiah Suit to have recorded and made valid a deed therein mentioned;

Read the second time and will not pass.

The next in order is the bill from the senate entitled, an act to incorporate the Maryland and New York Coal and Iron Manufacturing Company;

Read the second time and will not pass.

The next in order is the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Benedict Steam Milling and Manufacturing Company;

Read the second time and will pass.

The next in order is the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Library Association of the Mechanical Fire Company;

Read the second time and will pass.

The next in order is the bill entitled, an act regulating fences in Frederick county;

Read the second time.

Mr. Spence moved to refer the said bill to the consideration of the next General Assembly of Maryland.

And on the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.
