

The next in order is the unfavorable report of the committee on claims, on the memorial of J. D. Woodsides, of the District of Columbia;

Mr. Spence moved that the house do now adjourn;

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.

Mr. Tuck moved as a substitute for said unfavorable report the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised to pay James D. Woodsides three hundred dollars, in testimony of the benefit derived to the State, from his skill and labor in erecting the statue of Washington to the summit of the monument, erected to his memory in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read.

Mr. Spence moved to amend said resolution by striking out the words "Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is," and insert "Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, out of the city treasury, be and they are."

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.

Mr. Spence then moved to amend said resolution by striking out all after the words "resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland," and inserting the following:

"That his Excellency the Governor, be and he is hereby requested to tender to James D. Woodsides, Esquire, an expression of the gratitude and thanks of this Legislature for having raised the statue of Washington to the summit of the Washington monument in Baltimore."

Which was read.

On the question being put,

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the substitute offered by Mr. Tuck to the unfavorable report of the committee on claims;
