Section 1. Be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act it shall not be lawful to imprison in this State for debt any person or persons; provided, however, that the person or persons so indebted shall solemnly swear that they have not the means to pay his or their debts in part or whole, and that he or they have not lost any part of his or their means at gambling, or contracted any debt or debts with the intention at the time of contracting not to pay them.

Which was read.

On the question being put, will the house adopt the said amendment?

Mr. Temples moved to amend said bill by striking out in the second line of the 12th section the word "May" and inserting the word "September;"
