

And also, the bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act providing for the appointment of lime inspectors for the city of Baltimore, and prescribing their duties, passed December session 1832;

Amendment proposed.

In the 4th section 10th line, after the word "inspected" strike out the balance of the section and insert "when the same has been bought for agricultural purposes, unless where the purchaser in such case shall require an inspection."

Read the first and by special order the second time, assented to and ordered to be engrossed.

The first in order is the bill entitled, an act to provide for the payment of the public debts to promote improvements, and to support the government of this State;
