Mr. Parke, from the committee on education made the following REPORT:

The committee on education, to whom was referred the memorial of the Trustees of Lower Marlbro' Academy, have had the same under consideration, and respectfully beg leave to report unfavorably thereon.

It appears by reference to a law of 1821, chapter 171, passed February 19th 1822, that the sum of five hundred dollars of the State's donation to Charlotte Hall School was taken away and appropriated to Lower Marlbro' Academy, in Calvert county, which donation was paid by the Treasurer of the Western Shore to the trustees of said academy in the month of June of the same year. It also further appears by resolution number 50, passed March 27th, 1838, that a portion of said donation to the Lower Marlbro' Academy was taken from it and given to Battle Creek Academy in the same county, which donation was paid to the Trustees of Battle Creek Academy the same year.
