So the house refused to strike out the said section.

On motion of Mr. Giles,

The following was added as an additional section:

Sec. 6. "And be it further enacted, that the rights and franchises hereby granted, so far as respects the rights to draw said lottery shall cease and determine at the end of the year 1845;"

On motion of Mr. Waters,

The following was added as an additional section:

And be it enacted, that the managers of the said lottery herein before named be and they are hereby authorised to sell and assign said scheme if they shall deem it most advisable to do so, provided that the sum specified in the foregoing provisions of this bill shall be raised clear of all commissions and expenses.

Mr. Waters then moved to amend said bill by adding as an additional section the following:

"And be it enacted that whenever the said turnpike road may be made by means of money raised as aforesaid, the said road shall be a free road, and shall be kept in repair by the respective counties as other public roads are kept in repair;"

On the question being put—

It was determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the bill, and on being put,

Said bill was passed and sent to the sent.
