And the bill, entitled, an act to provide for taking the vote of this State as to the expediency of calling a convention to reform the present and frame a new constitution, so as to enable the Legislature to call such convention.

Severally endorsed "will not pass."

On motion of Mr. Simmons,

The house took up for consideration the bill, entitled, an act supplementary to the several acts relating to the regulation of the sale of spirituous liquors in this State;

Mr. Martin moved to amend said bill by adding the following: "provided this act shall not extend to Talbot and Worcester

counties;"

Which was read.

Mr. Bramwell moved to amend said amendment by adding thereto the following: except in Carroll county, who shall apply to the county clerk of said county;

Which was read.

On motion of Mr. Waters,

The house was called and the door-keeper sent after the absent members in the city.

On motion of Mr. Giles,

The house proceeded with the ordinary business of the session in the absence of the door-keeper.

On motion of Mr. Giles,

The house took up for consideration the amendment from the senate to the bill, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to provide for the administration of justice in cases of crimes and misdemeanors in the city and precincts of Baltimore, passed 1810, chapter 193;

Read the second time, assented to and ordered to be engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Seidenstricker,

The house took up for consideration the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be and he is hereby directed to accept a draft of the directors of the Maryland Penitentiary, for the sum of ten thousand dollars, payable on the ninth day of March 1842, it being the last portion of an appropriation made for the use of the Penitentiary, under resolution No. 29, passed December session 1838;

Read the second time, assented to and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Berry,

The house took up for consideration the amendments from the senate to the bill, entitled, an act to make valid a deed from Henry Laman and Feana his wife, to Jacob Otto;

Read the second time, assented to and ordered to be engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Stansbury,

The house took up for consideration the bill, entitled, an act to divorce Louis H. Gouley of the city of Baltimore, from his wife. Mary Gouley;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.
