The title of said bill was amended by striking out "Talbot county," and inserting "the several counties therein mentioned."

Mr. Seidenstricker, chairman of the select committee appointed to investigate into the causes of the failure of the Bank of Maryland and other insolvent institutions, made a report.

Which was read,

Mr. Le Grand moved that the said report and testimony accompanying the same be printed;

On motion of Mr. Spence,

The said report and testimony, together with the motion to print were recommitted to the said committee;

On motion of Waters,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act, relating to free negroes and slaves, passed December session 1831, chapter 323, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Waters,

Said bill was amended by striking out all after the word "four"

and inserting the following:

"At the expiration of which time it shall be the duty of the white person or persons, authorised by the act to which this is a supplement to hold such meetings, to dismiss such assemblage in a quiet and orderly manner, and if such assemblage shall continue after the white person or persons have left it, it shall be the duty of the nearest constable, on being notified of the fact to disperse such meeting."

The clerk of the Senate returned the resolution in favor of Thomas C. Nichols and others, of Talbot county, and John Par-

vin and others, of Dorchester county;

Endorsed, "assented to" and ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered a bill entitled, an act to authorise William G. Krebbs, trustee, to lease certain property of Tudor Beall and Ann Catharine Beall in the city of Baltimore;

Endorsed "will pass."

Read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts

of justice.

Also, a bill, entitled, an act to condemn and lay off a lot of ground for a public landing through the lands of Howell Powell on Dividing Creek, in Talbot county, and make a public road therein mentioned;

Endorsed "will pass."

Read and referred to the Talbot county delegation.

And returned the bill entitled, an act to allow Basil Duvall of Jesse, to change the location of a public road in Anne Arundel county;

The bill, entitled, a supplement to the act of 1779, chapter 25,

regulating officers fees;

The bill, entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, passed December session 1835, establishing magistrates' courts in the several counties of this State, and prescribing their duties, so far as relates to St. Mary's county;
