So the house refused to suspend the rule.

The rule being suspended,

Mr. Tuck, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to whom was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise William G. Krebs, trustee, to lease certain property of Tudor Beall and Ann Catharine Beall, in the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

Also, from the same committee, reported a bill entitled, an act to give Baltimore City Court jurisdiction in a certain case therein mentioned.

And also, a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William Rothwell, administrator of John R. Francis;

Severally read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The next in order is the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of the trustees of the poor house of Baltimore county, passed at December session 1818, chapter 122.

Mr. Seidenstricker moved the following as an amendment to said bill, to come in at the end of the 2d section:

And that the trustees of the poor for the alms house of Baltimore county, who are appointed by the commissioners of Baltimore county, shall have no vote or right to sit at the meetings of the board of trustees, appointed by the city of Baltimore or in any way connected with the management of said alms house.
