Mr. Shaw, from the committee on education, made the following

REPORT:

The committee on education, to whom was referred the petition of sundry citizens of Dorchester county, setting forth the donations to academies in said county as a grievance, and praying that the donations may be withdrawn and distributed amongst the several school districts in said county, ask leave to report that the prayer of the petitioners is at variance with the settled policy of the State, academies form an integral and highly important part of our system of education, occupying as it were a middle ground between the primary schools and colleges. The committee believe that the fund allowed by the State to each county for the support of academies, would do more good if concentrated on some approved one, in each county, than by its division, but that its usefulness and efficiency would be almost utterly destroyed by being scattered amongst the several school districts, for example take the instance of the petitioners, their donation for academies is \$800, their number of school districts 47, divide this amount among them, and the insignificance of the quota (17 dollars) we feel assured will convince the petitioners of the propriety of this unfavorble report.
