academy in said county," have considered the amendments proposed by the senate, and are constrained to differ with that hono-

rable body.

The first amendment proposed is in the following words, viz: "add as a preamble the following, whereas there is a disposition to establish academies in Somerset county, and that not by the fund of those benefitted by the same."

Your committee think they know something of the people of Somerset county, and respectfully state that they are not aware of the existence of any such disposition in the people of said county.

The second amendment requires "the commissioners of tax for Somerset county to pay to the Franklin academy \$200 out of the poor school funds of said county." Your committee cannot find that any body known as "commissioners of the tax" exists, the legislature having abolished said body some years since; and they are equally at a loss to find what is meant by the "poor school fund of Somerset county," believing that there is no such fund.—But your committee waive the discussion of the amendments, and recommend the reference of the whole subject to the next General Assembly.
