Order offered by Mr. Potter, so to amend the, as to have his name recorded in the affirmative, instead of the negative, on the bill to elect commissioners in Carroll county, amendment to the, proposed by Mr. Hook and adopted 105.

Order directing an entry to be made on the, by Mr. Berry, 107.

Order directing that it be entered on the, that if Mr. Sprigg had been present he would have voted against the sub-treasury resolutions 119.

Order directing that it be entered on the, that if Messrs. Hammond, Biser, Seidenstricker, and Foard had been present, they would have voted for the sub-treasury resolutions 119.

Order directing it to be entered on the, that there being no business before the house, and much of importance before the committees, that the house adjourn 190.

Proposed to be amended, in relation to the message received from the senate on the subject of fixing the tenth day of March as the limit of all sessions of the General Assembly, and which had been decided as an encroachment upon the privileges of the house 225; various proceedings thereon 226; proposed to be corrected in relation to the said message, but refused 236.

Order directing it to be entered on the, that Mr. Hammond voted against the bill abolishing magistrates courts in Anne Arundel county 396.

Order directing it to be entered on the, that if Mr. Gallagher had been present when the bill for the regulation of the banking institutions of this State, was put upon its passage he would have voted in the affirmative 417.

Order, declaring the order adopted on the first of January, 1840, on page 15, of the, relative to the printing of the house rescinded, proposed and adopted 601.
