

Mr. Giles presented the memorial of the president and directors of the Baltimore and Susquehanna rail road company, praying a modification of the law of the last session in reference to said company;

Read and referred to the committee on internal improvements,
And ordered to be printed.

Mr. Graves presented the petition of the German Catholic Beneficial Society of the city of Baltimore, praying for an act of incorporation;

Read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Matthews asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill for the benefit of John Frisby Wilmer of Charles county;

Referred to Messrs. Matthews, Bowling and Bruce.

Mr. Risteau asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill entitled an act to amend the constitution and form of government of this State so as to prevent the judges of our county courts and city court of Baltimore from holding any other office of profit or trust while they shall act as such;

Referred to Messrs. Risteau Bruce and Hammond.

Mr. Polk asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill entitled an act for the relief of certain persons of color therein named.

Referred to Messrs. Polk, Hope and Sutton.

On motion of Mr. Mason,

Ordered, that the committee appointed on the 9th inst., under the leave to report a bill entitled an act to repeal the act entitled an act to provide for making a new and complete map and geological survey of this State, passed Dec. session 1833, ch. 138, so far as relates to the appointment of a geologist, be increased to seven, and that said committee be instructed to inquire and report to this House what progress the Topographical engineer has made in the said survey, and that said committee also inquire into the expediency of abolishing said office; as well as the office of Treasurer for the Eastern Shore, and judge of the Land office for the same shore, and that said committee also inquire into the propriety of consolidating into one the offices of Lottery commissioners.

Whereupon the Speaker appointed Messrs. Cottman, Giles, Wilmer and Matthews.

On motion of Mr. Mason,

Ordered, that the Treasurer of the W. Shore be requested to communicate to this House whether or not the terms of the 1st sec. of the act of Assembly of 1834, ch. 241, entitled "an act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for the completion of the Balt. and Susquehanna Rail Road, to the Borough of York in the State of Pennsylvania," so far as it requires the Ches. and Ohio canal company to enter into a certain agreement therein mentioned, has been complied with on the part of the said canal company, and if so, that the said treasurer be requested to transmit to this House a copy of said contract at as early a day as practicable.
