

Leatherberry, late collector of Somerset county, to complete his collections, reported the same with the proposed amendments ;

Amendments proposed, In the 6th line strike out the words "as are allowed to said Leatherberry in the same manner and to the same effect,"

In the 8th line strike out the word "two" and insert "one."

After the word "passage" insert "provided that nothing herein contained, shall be construed to effect the estate of any deceased person;"

On the question being put, will the House agree to the amendments?

Determined in the affirmative.

The bill then as amended was put to the question on its passage and being put was passed.

On motion of Mr. Quynn,

The House took up for consideration the resolutions in favor of Henrietta M. Frazier and of Sarah Sansbury ;

Which were severally read and assented to.

The House then took up for consideration the order of the day, being the resolutions submitted by Mr. Graves, on Tuesday the 7th inst. in reference to a constitutional currency.

The House was called, and the doorkeeper sent after the absent members.

On motion of Mr. Phelps,

The House proceeded with the ordinary business of the session in the absence of the doorkeeper.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act to amend the Magistrate's court law, so far as relates to Talbot county, passed at December session 1835, chapter 201 ;

Endorsed, "will pass" and ordered to be engrossed.

Also, delivered a bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed from William Ryan and wife, to Michael C. Sprigg ;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to repeal the eighth section of an act entitled, an act to establish Magistrate's courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction, passed at December session 1835, chapter 201, so far as the same relates to Kent county ;

Endorsed "will pass;"

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice ;

Also, the memorial of Joseph L. Smith and others, on the subject of Education ; endorsed, referred to the House of Delegates ;

Read and referred to the committee on education. —
