Mr. Gallagher reported a bill entitled an act to grant to Henry S. Sanderson, late sheriff of Baltimore county, further time to complete his collections;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Bowling, from the committee on that subject, reported a bill entitled an act to incorporate the Benedict Steam Milling and Manufacturing company;

Read the first time and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Poultney reported a bill entitled an act to authorise Catharine L. Cook to convey certain lands in Columbia county in the State of Pennsylvania;

Read the first, and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.
