The house then proceeded to consider the order of the day, being the bill reported by Mr. Gantt, entitled, an act to authorise the banks of the State of Maryland, to receive and pay out the orders drawn by the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, on the stock of the city of Baltimore;

On motion of Mr. Gantt,

Said bill was amended by inserting after the word "orders" in the second line, these words, "commonly known as the stock orders;"

On motion of Mr. Gantt,

Said bill was further amended by striking out these words, "commonly known as the stock orders of said Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company," and inserting in lieu thereof, the following, "of three millons of dollars authorised by the act of the General Assembly, passed at December session 1835, chapter 127;"

On motion of Mr. Gantt,

Said bill was further amended by adding at the end thereot, as an

additional section the following:

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That the President and Directors of the said company, shall at no time issue any amount of such orders beyond the amount of city stock actually paid to them by the city, and deposited in the hands of commissioners of the city in trust for the holders of the orders; nor shall such commissioners at any time accept orders beyond the amount of stock actually deposited in their hands in trust as aforesaid, and that for a violation of these provisions, the said President and Directors and the said Commissioners respectively, shall be individually responsible to the full extent of their private fortunes;

The said bill having been read through as amended, was placed in

the hands of the Speaker;

Mr. Bowie moved that said bill be withdrawn from the hands of the chair for the purpose of amendment;

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. E. A. Lynch then offered as a substitute for said bill "a bill reported by Mr. Bowie, entitled an act to authorise the incorporated banks of this State, to issue small notes for a limited time;"

Mr. Jones of Somerset, rose to a point of order, that the bill being an act reported to the house, and referred to the committee on ways

and means, it was not in order to submit it as a substitute;
