

The bill, entitled an act to incorporate the New Windsor Library Company;

Also the bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Potomac Steam Packet Company, passed at December session 1828, ch. 183;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. E. A. Lynch, Richardson, Naill, Wm. Lynch and Motter.

Mr. Seidenstricker presented the petition of J. B. Sumwalt and others, against the passage of a law for an increase of tolls by the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

Mr. Shower presented the petition of James D. Woodside, of the city of Washington, praying remuneration for services rendered, in raising the statue on Washington's Monument in the city of Baltimore;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Shower, Hooper and Weast.

Mr. Ford presented the petition of Woolman J. Gibson, of Queen Anne's county, praying that certain powers may be vested in the orphan's court of said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
