Resolved in the affirmative;

And the house accordingly adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 23d, 1841.

The house met. Present at the call of the roll the following members:

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Welsh of Baltimore county, presented the petition of sundry citizens of Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties, counter to the petition of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, respecting an increase of tolls on said rail road;

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal im-

provements.

Mr. Brewer presented the petition of the heirs and legal representatives of Thomas Goldsmith, an officer of the revolution, praying to be allowed money in lieu of land granted them for the revolutionary services of said Goldsmith;

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and

revolutionary claims.

Mr. Thayer obtained leave to bring in a bill for the benefit of James Piercy, of Allegany county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Thayer, Coombs and Sprigg of Allegany

report the same.

Mr. Shower submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be, and he is hereby authorised and required to purchase, and place in to the clerk's office of Carroll county court, for the use of said court, one copy of "Raymond's Digested Chancery Cases," and one copy of "Alexander's Maryland Chancery Practice;" and that the Treasurer of the Western Shore is hereby authorised to pay the cost thereof to the Librarian, on his certifying thereto;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time;

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Said resolution was referred to the joint committee on the library. Mr. Nicols, from the committee on ways and means, made an unfavorable report upon the memorial of the Managers of the Washington Monument, praying that an annual sum may be granted for the completion of that work, in lieu of the surplus of the lotteries;
