

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Forman, from the committee on internal improvement, reported a bill, entitled an act to repeal certain parts of an act, entitled an act relating to charges for transportation upon the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time;

On motion of Mr. Presstman,

Said bill was made the order of the day for Tuesday next, the 26th instant, and ordered to be printed.

Mr. Welsh of Baltimore county, reported a bill, entitled an act to give to Peter W. Gibbons and William Frush, of Baltimore county, further time to make their collections;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled an act to alter and change the name of Isaac Smith, of Washington county, to the name of Isaac Smith Clayton;

Also the bill, entitled an act to incorporate the town of Frostburg, in Allegany county;

Severally endorsed "will pass" and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed; also

The resolution relative to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company;

Endorsed "assented to," and the resolution ordered to be engrossed;

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the Senate, viz:

A bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act in aid of the construction of an out-let lock of the Tide water canal at Bell's ferry, in Harford county, immediately opposite to Port Deposit, in Cecil county, passed at December session 1839, ch. 234, and also to the act of 1838, ch. 416, entitled an act to ensure the completion of the Susquehanna Canal and of the Tide Water Canal;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Maxwell, Simcoe, Morton, Hope, Billingslea, Whiteford and Tuck.

And a bill, entitled an act supplemental to an act, entitled an act respecting the equity jurisdiction of county courts;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice;

And a communication from the Secretary of the Baltimore and Havre de Grace Turnpike Company, containing an abstract of the accounts of said company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvements.

The hour having arrived for taking up the order of the day, the house resumed the consideration of the unfinished order of yesterday, being the preamble and resolutions submitted by Mr. Forman,
