Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the only legitimate basis of a paper circulation is the constitutional currency of the country, and that corporate institutions, whether federal or state, which by the inherent nature of the system upon which they are founded, are continually liable to a suspension of specie payment of their responsibilities, are not the proper depositories of the people's treasure, and therefore as some depository is requisite, the only one consistent with an independence of the public treasury, such institutions, is an independent treasury system such as was adopted by the congress of the United States at its sessions, 1839-'40.
