So the order was adopted.

The bill reported by Mr. Nesbitt, entitled an act to abolish magistrates' courts within this State, and to extend the jurisdiction of single justices in certain cases, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Nesbitt,

Said bill was made the order of the day for Wednesday, the 3d February.

The bill reported by Mr. Graves, entitled an act to incorporate the Maryland College of Pharmacy,

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Nesbitt, entitled an act to reduce and establish a uniform system of charges by notaries public on all protested notes, drafts and bills of exchange, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Nesbitt,

Said bill was recommitted.

The bill reported by Mr. Tuck, from the committee on Corporations, entitled, an act to incorporate the Port Deposit Library Association; also,

The bill reported by him, entitled, an act to authorise the trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church on Liberty circuit, to hold certain property therein mentioned;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and severally passed.

Mr. Maxwell, chairman of the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the Senate, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act in aid of the completion of an outlet lock of the Tide Water Canal at Bell's Ferry, in Harford county, immediately opposite Port Deposit, in Cecil county, passed at December session, 1839, chap. 234; and also, to the act of 1838, ch. 416, entitled, an act to ensure the completion of the Susquehanna Canal, and of the Tide Water Canal;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
