THURSDAY, JANUARY 28, 1841.

The house met. Present at the call of the roll the following members:

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in favor of Somerville Pinkney and John J. Lloyd, passed on yesterday, was sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate, entitled an act to enlarge the powers of courts of equity, was returned to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Ordered, That the committee on ways and means be discharged from the further consideration of the several memorials referred to them in relation to licenses to hawkers and pedlars, and that the same be referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The Speaker presented the petition of Benedict Reynolds, a soldier of the revolution, praying for a pension; and

Mr. Brewer presented the petition of Mary Butler, (widow of Nace Butler,) a soldier of the revolution, praying for a pension;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. E. A. Lynch presented the memorial of Adam Keller, George Lorentz and others, relating to licenses to hawkers and pedlars;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. E. A. Lynch also presented the petition of John J. Smith, William Slifer and others, praying the division of school district No. 11, in Frederick county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. E. A. Lynch, William Lynch, Nail, Motter and Richardson.
