The question was then put, on the second part of the amendment, by inserting after the word "mile," the following, "except the article of flour, ten barrels of which shall be taken for a ton, and no charge to be made for weighing," and

Determined in the affirmative;

On motion of Mr. E. A. Lynch,

Said bill was further amended by adding at the end thereof as an additional section, the following:

And be it enacted, That the right is hereby expressly reserved to the State of Maryland to repeal or alter this law at pleasure;

Mr. Graves moved further to amend said bill, by inserting after the word "marble," in the last line of the 1st section the following, "granite, soap-stone, lime-stone and lime,"

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Graves moved further to amend said section by adding at the end thereof, the following:

"And free from all other charges except those of actual warehousing and loading and unloading; and this provision shall equally apply to the transportation of the said articles of marble, granite, soap-stone, lime-stone, and lime, upon the Washington Branch of said Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road,"

Determined in the negative.
