Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the propo-
sition so to alter the constitution of the United States, as to limit the
Presidential service to one term, lately made in the Senate of the U.
States, meets the approbation of this General Assembly.

Resolved, That a copy of the foregoing resolution be transmitted
to our Senators and Representatives in Congress.
