

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,

Seconded by two other members who voted in the majority, the house reconsidered their vote upon the bill reported by Mr. Le Grand, entitled an act to revive an act, entitled an act authorising certain alterations in Baltimore county and city court rooms, passed December session 1817, ch. 7;

The said bill was then laid on the table.

Mr. Lecompte submitted the following resolution:

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Librarian be directed to purchase as many copies of "Raymond's Digested Chancery Cases," as will furnish one to each of the offices of the clerks of the county courts and registers of wills of the several counties of the State, one for the office of the clerk of Baltimore city court, one for the clerk of the Court of Appeals, one for the Court of Chancery, and four for the use of the State Library; provided, the costs thereof shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and eighty-eight dollars; and that the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to pay for the same to the above amount, on the order of the Librarian.

Which was read; and

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Referred to the committee on the library.

The Speaker announced that the hour had arrived for taking up the order of the day;

The house postponed the consideration of the order of the day.

Mr. Brent, from the committee on colored population, reported a bill, entitled an act to authorise Emily H. Garnett to bring into the State certain negroes therein mentioned;

Mr. Brent, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill, entitled an act to vest certain powers in the orphan's court of Queen Anne's county;

Mr. Le Grand, from the committee on corporations, reported a bill, entitled an act to incorporate the German Herman Beneficial Society of Baltimore;

Mr. Le Grand, from the same committee, also reported a bill, entitled a further supplement to the act, entitled an act to incorporate the Marine Insurance Company;

Mr. Boyle reported a bill, entitled an act authorising the commissioners of tax of Carroll county to levy a sum of money to build a bridge over Big Pipe creek, on the road from Taneytown to Middleburg; and
