The bill reported by Mr. Nesbitt, entitled an act to reduce and establish a uniform system of charges by notaries public on all protested notes, drafts and bills of exchange, was taken up for consideration;

Said bill was laid on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Poultney, entitled an act relating to rail roads in the State of Maryland, was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Orrick,

Said bill was laid on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Simcoe entitled an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned, was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Said bill was referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

On motion of Mr. Brent,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him from the committee on colored population, entitled an act to authorise Emily H. Garnett, to bring into the State certain negroes therein mentioned,

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Jones, from the committee on ways and means, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to prevent obstruction in Smith's, and other private docks, in the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Jones of Somerset,

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Tuck, entitled an act to provide for repairing the court house, in Prince George's county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Tall,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
