On motion of Mr. Sutton,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house the petition to incorporate the town of Havre De Grace;

On motion of Mr. E. A. Lynch,

Ordered, That it be entered upon the journal, that if Mr. E. A. Lynch, of Frederick, had been in his seat and not engaged elsewhere in the discharge of his duties, when this house passed the supplement to an act, entitled an act to repair injuries done by rail road carriages and engines, upon the several rail roads of this State, passed December session 1838 chapter 244, by which the agents of such companies are disqualified as witnesses in its behalf, he would have voted in the negative.

The bill reported by Mr. Hillen, entitled an act to make valid the official acts of John B. Joy, a justice of the peace, in and for Calvert county, and the State of Maryland, was taken up for considera-

tion,

Read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Lecompte, entitled an act to lay out, open, and make public, a road in Frederick and Carroll counties, was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Boyle, addition and beloscond relais A. All

Said bill was laid on the table.

The resolution in favor of James D. Woodside, was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Causin,

Said resolution was laid on the table.

Mr. Causin submitted the following message, which was read and assented to.

By the House of Delegates, February 2, 1841.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We respectfully request you to return to this house a bill "entitled a supplement to an act to repair injuries done by rail road carriages and engines, upon the several rail road companies of this State, passed December session 1838, ch. 245.
