

The bill entitled an act to make valid and confirm the official acts of John B. Joy, a justice of the peace, in and for Calvert county and the State of Maryland; also

The message in relation to the bill entitled a supplement to an act to repair injuries done by rail road carriages and engines upon the several rail road carriages of this State; also

The bill entitled an act to alter and change the names of Henry D. Bull, Ann S. Bull, Fanny M. Bull, and Mary E. Bull, of Baltimore city, to the names of Henry D. Preston, Ann S. Preston, Fanny M. Preston, and Mary E. Preston; also

The bill entitled an act supplementary to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the Farmer's and Planter's Bank of Baltimore, passed at December session 1835, ch. 315, and to repeal the 1st and 2nd sections of an act, passed at December session 1833, ch. 218; also

The bill entitled an act to authorise the commissioners for Somerset county, to allow additional compensation to their clerk for certain extra services therein mentioned; also

The bill entitled an act for the relief of Henry Thomas, of Somerset county; also

The bill entitled an act to authorise Emily H. Garnett, to bring into the State certain negroes therein mentioned; also

The bill entitled an act to authorise Ephraim Rochhold, of Perry county, Ohio, to execute a deed to Abraham Secrest, of Baltimore county, Maryland; also

The bill entitled an act to incorporate the German Herman Beneficial Society of Baltimore; also

The bill entitled an act to change the mode of electing the commissioners of the tax, for Howard District, in Anne Arundel county; also

The bill entitled a further supplement to an act passed at December session 1828, ch. 21, entitled an act to abolish the levy court of Anne Arundel county, and for other purposes; also

The bill entitled an act to prohibit the issuing of licenses to free negroes and mulattoes; also

The bill entitled an act to make valid a certain deed therein mentioned; and

The bill entitled, an act to provide for repairing the court house in Prince George's county;

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act in aid of the construction of an out-let lock of the Tide Water Canal, at Bell's Ferry in Harford county, immediately opposite to Port Deposit, in Cecil county, passed at December session 1839, ch. 234, and also to the act of 1838, ch. 416, entitled an act to ensure the completion of the Susquehanna Canal and of the Tide Water Canal; also
