Carroll county, to levy a sum of money, to build a bridge over Big Pipe Creek, on the road from Taney Town to Middleburg;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first and by a special order the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed; also

The bill entitled an act to vest certain powers in the corporation of the city of Baltimore, in relation to the collection of taxes and other claims.

Endorsed "committee discharged from the consideration of this bill, and the clerk directed to return it to the House of Delegates in conformity with the message of this date, Feb. 4th, 1841;"

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Le Grand, Graves,

Presstman, Seidenstricker and Gallagher.

And delivered a bill, originated in and passed by the senate, entitled a further supplement to the act, entitled an act in aid of the construction of a State Armory and Town Hall in the city of Baltimore, and the re-building and improvement of the Hanover market house in said city;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Le Grand, Graves, Sei-

denstricker, Presstman, and Gallagher.

Also, the following message:
