Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice, enquire into the expediency and mode of procuring such a repeal or modification of the ordinance of Baltimore city, as will relieve captains and owners of vessels, from the tax now imposed upon articles placed on board of vessels at the wharves, in Baltimore, and also to report such measures, if to them it seems expedient, as may relieve the sellers of wood from the evils growing out of the present system of renting out wharves to wood hucksters;
