Said bill was amended by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section the following:

And be it enacted, That this act shall have no effect until the commissioners, by this act appointed, before they proceed to draw, or cause to be drawn such scheme or schemes, shall file a bond to the State of Maryland, with security to be approved by the lottery commissioners of this State, to pay into the treasury five per cent. upon the amount by this act authorised to be raised;
