

Mr. Dalrymple, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Frederick G. Harman and others, praying that certain acts may be made valid;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Dalrymple, from the same committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled an act to make valid the sale therein mentioned, reported unfavorably thereon, and recommended its rejection;

The said bill was then read the first, and by special order the second time, rejected, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Seidenstricker, from the committee on divorces, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Lydia Fissel, praying to be divorced from her husband, Jacob Fissel;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Seidenstricker reported a bill, entitled an act to confer upon the Corporation of the city of Baltimore power to collect taxes due to said Corporation; and

Mr. Sutton reported a bill, entitled a supplement to an act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned, passed at December session 1839, ch. 309;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Morton, from the committee on divorces made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Ann Lloyd, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a divorce from her husband, James Lloyd;

Mr. Naill, from the same committee, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Ann Dempsey, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband, William Demsey;

Also made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Rachel Knight, of the city of Baltimore, praying for a divorce from her husband, John Knight;

Mr. Wm. Lynch, from the committee on divorces, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Mary Jane Spedden, to be divorced from her husband, Joseph Spedden;

Also made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Hezekiah Gardner, praying to be divorced from his wife, Ruth Ann Gardner;

Mr. Jones, of Kent, from the Committee on Divorces, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of John Bowlus, praying to be divorced from his wife Barbara Bowlus.

And, Mr. Frazier, chairman of the committee on divorces, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Sarah Ann Hoblitzell, praying for a divorce from her husband Dennis B. Hoblitzell;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, and severally concurred in.
