So the message was assented to.

The bill reported by Mr. Poultney, entitled, an act regulatting the joint property of the city and county of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Poultney,

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Morton, from the committee on divorces, entitled, an act to divorce Levin Jones, of Baltimore city, from his wife Elizabeth Jane Jones, a mensa et thoro, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

Said bill was amended, by striking out the words, "a mensa et thoro," and inserting in lieu thereof "a vinculo matrimonii."

The said bill was then read the second time, as amended, and passed.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled a supplement to an act passed at the present session, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Potomac Steam Packet Company, passed at December session 1828, ch. 183;

Also the bill, entitled an act to authorise Aquilla Napoleon Howard Meeks, to take and use the name of Howard Meeks;

Also the bill, entitled a supplement to an act passed March the 20th, 1840, entitled an act to provide for the appointment of commissioners to assess and award damages to sundry citizens of Carroll county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to prohibit the construction of county roads within the limits of Washington county, in certain cases;

Severally endorsed "will pass" and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also the bill, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to incorporate the town of Havre de Grace, in Harford county, passed at December session 1830, ch. 267,

Endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment,"

Which amendment was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the Senate, viz.

A bill, entitled an act to confirm the titles of purchasers under the deeds therein referred to;

A bill, entitled an act relating to the administration of justice; and

The bill, entitled an act in respect to insurances for lives for the benefit of married women;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.
