

Mr. Frazier offered as a substitute for said report, a bill entitled an act to divorce Henry Elliott, of the city of Baltimore, from his wife, Celeste Elliott;

Which was read; and

On motion of Mr. Frazier,

Said report and substitute were laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Heard,

The house took up for consideration the report and resolutions submitted by him on the 1st inst., as chairman of the select committee, or so much of the Governor's Message as relates to the Tobacco trade;

The said report and resolutions were then read the second time, the report concurred in and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. Cathell submitted the following order:

Ordered. That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby authorised and required to sell the State's Tobacco Warehouses, in the city of Baltimore, and apply the proceeds of said sales to the payment of the State's debt.

Which was twice read;

Mr. Causin moved that said order be rejected,

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Prince George's,

Leave was granted the committee on inspections, to bring in a bill to reduce into one the several acts of Assembly, relating to the inspection of tobacco in the State warehouses in the city of Baltimore, with amendments thereto;

On motion of Mr. Sutton,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled an act to regulate the building of wharves on the river Susquehanna;

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Maccubbin,

The house took up for consideration the unfavorable report of the committee on colored population, upon the petition of William Brewer, of the city of Annapolis, praying the passage of a law authorising him to manumit a certain negro slave therein mentioned; and

The substitute offered therefor by Mr. Brewer, being a bill, entitled an act for the relief of William Brewer;

On the question being put, will the house adopt said substitute? it was

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon concurring in the report of the committee; and

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Billingslea,

The house took up for consideration the amendment proposed by the senate, to the bill entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act
