The house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Jones of Somerset, from the committee on ways and means, entitled a supplement to an act, entitled an act to prevent obstruction in Smith's docks, in the city of Baltimore;

The said bill was then read the second time passed and sent to the senate.

Mr. Maxwell reported a bill, entitled an act to limit the number of justices of the peace, appointed in and for Cecil county;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Graves reported a bill, entitled an act to provide for the re-organization of the city court of Baltimore, and for the more prompt administration of justice in said city;

Which was read; and

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Made the order of the day for Monday, 22d inst.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the last session, the papers of Nancy Coward, an applicant for remuneration for the services of her husband during the revolutionary war, and that the same be referred to the committee on revolutionary claims.

The bill reported by Mr. Maxwell, entitled an act to provide for the appointment of a wood corder in the town of Port Deposit, in Cecil county; and

The bill reported by Mr. Jones of Somerset, entitled an act to authorise the commissioners for Somerset county, to provide a new seal for the clerk's office of said county;

Were severally taken up for consideration, and severally passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Nesbitt, entitled an act to incorporate the town of Jerusalem (commonly called Funks town) in Washington county;

Was taken up for consideration,

On motion of Mr. Le Grand,

Said bill was amended by striking out in the 1st section thereof the word "perpetual;"

The said bill was then read the second time as amended passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Gallagher, entitled an act to incorporate the Howard Temperance Society, of Fell's Point;

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.
