

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 17, 1841.

The house met. Present at the call of the roll the following members:

The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled an act to provide for the destruction of the notes of insolvent Banks, in certain cases;

Also the bill, entitled an act for the relief of Thomas Ashcom, of Queen Anne's county;

Also the bill, entitled an act to repeal an act passed at December session 1826, ch. 129;

And the message in relation to the bill, entitled an act for the benefit of the commissioners appointed under and by virtue of the act passed 19th March, 1835,

Were sent to the senate.

The bill from the senate, entitled an act to incorporate the Eastern Hotel Company of Cumberland, in the town of Cumberland,

Was returned to the senate.

Mr. Gallagher presented the memorial of the manufacturers and dealers in ground black oak bark, and others, residing in the city of Baltimore, praying for the passage of a further supplement to the act, entitled an act to provide for the inspection of ground black oak bark intended for exportation, passed in 1821, ch. 77;

Which was read and referred to the committee on inspections.

Mr. Sutton presented the memorial of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, captains of vessels and others, interested in the navigation of the Chesapeake Bay and the commerce of the city, remonstrating against the passage of an act to incorporate the Patapsco Canal and navigation company, also

Presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Havre de Grace, in Harford county, and its vicinity, remonstrating against the passage of an act to incorporate the Patapsco Canal and Navigation Company;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Gaither presented the petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying the Legislature to affix a penalty to an act passed at December session 1829, ch. 19, entitled an act to regulate the measurement of oats;
