

"And provided also, That no license granted as aforesaid, shall extend beyond the shore in which such license may issue;"

Mr. Causin moved further to amend said bill, by adding at the end of the 3d section the following:

"And for such refusal, shall be liable to a fine of one dollar, for every such offence, to be recovered as provided for in the section;"

Determined in the negative.

Mr. Lecompte moved to amend said bill, by striking out in the 3rd section, 3rd line, from the word "aforesaid," to the end of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"Who shall refuse at the request of any sheriff or constable, to show his or their license, may be apprehended by the said sheriff or constable, and he may take the said hawker or pedlar before any justice of the peace, who may upon its appearing that the said hawker or pedlar, has not a license, fine him in the sum of"

Determined in the negative;

On motion of Mr. Shower,

Said bill was amended by striking out, in the 4th section, the word "one," and inserting in lieu thereof "three."

The said bill having been read through as amended, the question was put, shall the said bill pass?

Resolved in the affirmative.

The Speaker announced that the hour had arrived for taking up the orders of the day;

Mr. Gantt moved to suspend the consideration of the order of the day, for the purpose of moving to reconsider the vote of the house upon the report and resolutions adopted on yesterday, in relation to the public lands;

Determined in the negative.

The house then proceeded to the consideration of the orders of the day, the first order of the day being the bill from the senate, entitled an act to incorporate the Patapsco Canal and Navigation Company, and the amendments reported thereto, from the committee on corporations;

The amendments reported by the committee having been read the second time were assented to:

The said bill was then read the second time, as amended;

On motion of Mr. Williams,

The house was called and the doorkeeper sent for the absent members;

On motion of Mr. Williams,

The house resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the doorkeeper.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill entitled an act to repeal certain parts of an act, entitled an act relating to charges for transportation upon the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road; also
