

The bill, entitled an act regulating the licenses of hawkers and pedlars, and for other purposes,

Were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Gallagher submitted the following message, which was read assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned sent to the senate.

*By the House of Delegates,*

February 20th, 1841.

*Gentlemen of the Senate:*

We herewith return to your honorable body the bill, entitled an act to divorce Mary McKewen, of the city of Baltimore, from her husband, William McKewen, and respectfully ask you to reconsider and pass the same.

Mr. Le Grand presented the proceedings of the grand jury for the city of Baltimore, in relation to the removal of cases to adjoining counties;

Which was read and referred to the committee on the constitution.

Mr. Presstman presented the petition of Sarah Roberts, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband, Samuel Roberts;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. Tuck presented the memorial of David Ridgely, for the adoption of a work illustrative of the geography and history of Maryland, for the instruction of youth, to be used in the elementary schools of the State;

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Dorsey presented the petition of Mrs. C. M. Morris, for leave to alter the route of the Washington and Baltimore turnpike road, on the Waterloo farm, Howard District, in Anne Arundel county, and resolution of Board of Managers in relation thereto;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Dorsey, Estep and Gantt.

Mr. Tall presented the petition of John Woolford, praying that his name may be changed to John Keene;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Tall, Frazier, and Jacobs.

On motion of Mr. Le Grand,

Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims enquire whether the heirs of the late Major Alexander Roxburgh, an officer of the revolution, be entitled to any thing under the resolution passed by the House of Delegates March 25th, 1779; and if so, to report a resolution to provide for the payment of the same.

On motion of Mr. Le Grand,

Ordered, That when this house adjourns, that it adjourns to meet on Monday next, at 12 o'clock.

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Leave was granted the committee on grievances and courts of justice to bring in a bill, entitled a further supplement to the act, enlarging the powers of the High Court of Chancery.
