

The bill, entitled an act to provide for the destruction of the notes of insolvent Banks in certain cases, severally endorsed "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed;

And the following message:

By the Senate,

February 20th, 1841.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have dissented from the resolution in favor of Somerville Pinkney and J. J. Lloyd, because the sums therein mentioned is too large. The sum paid to the treasurer was \$289 25, and deducting therefrom the costs of suit due from Burch, (\$28 05) the balance is \$268 90.

A resolution directing the treasurer to pay this sum, if sent to us, by your honorable body, will be agreed to.

If the further sum allowed is on account of interest, we have to observe, that although there may be cases in which it would be proper, for the State to pay interest, yet this is not one of them. Upon a claim like this, against a private individual, interest could well be asked with justice.

It certainly was not the fault of the State, that the mistake, now proposed to be corrected, was committed.
