

Mr. Brewer submitted the following message; which was read and assented to:

By the House of Delegates,
February 22, 1841.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We have received your message of the 20th inst., returning the resolution in favor of Somerville Pinkney and John J. Lloyd, which has been rejected by your honorable body, and suggesting that your honorable body would assent to a resolution directing the payment of a different sum.

We have passed, and herewith send you a resolution directing the Treasurer to pay them the sum mentioned in your message.

Mr. Brewer then submitted the following resolution:

Resolved, That the Treasur of the Western Shore pay to Somerville Pinkney and John J. Lloyd, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the sum of two hundred and sixty-eight dollars and twenty cents, being the amount paid by them as trustees for the sale of the estates of Joseph N. Burch, sen, in satisfaction of a claim appearing by the book of the Treasurer to be due by George H. Lanham, sheriff of Prince George's county, on whose official bond the said Burch was a surety, and it now appearing that the debt had been made under a writ of fieri facias issued against said Lanham.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, and assented to.

Mr. Martin submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates,
February 16th, 1841.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We respectfully ask your honorable body to return to this house, a bill, passed by us, on Wednesday the 17th inst. "entitled an act to prohibit any corporation, or individual, or association of individuals, from issuing any paper intended to circulate as money or currency;" that the same may be reconsidered by this house.
