On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Leave was granted the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to bring in a bill, entitled an act to repeal certain portions of the act passed at December session, 1830, ch. 185, entitled an act to prevent unnecessary expense and delay in prosecuting appeals from courts exercising equity jurisdiction in this State.

Mr. Weast obtained leave to bring in a bill, for the benefit of Joseph Knox, of Washington county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Weast, Wm. Lynch, and Nesbitt, report the same.

Mr. Orrell obtained leave to bring in a bill, to make valid the acts and proceedings of William D. Voshall, one of the justices of the peace in and for Caroline county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Orrell, Sullivan, and Nicols, report the same.

Mr. Matthews, chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favorable report upon the petition of Mary Moore, praying for a pension, accompanied with the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, pay to Mary Moore, widow of John Moore, deceased, a soldier of the revolution, or her order, the half pay of a private during her life, in consideration of the services rendered by her deceased husband, the said John Moore.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to.
