

Mr. Tuck reported a bill, entitled an act to make public a road in Prince George's county;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and passed.

Mr. Tall, chairman of the select committee, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled an act to alter and change the place of holding the election in the fourth election district of Dorchester county;

Which was read,

The said bill was then read the second time by a special order, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Gantt,

(Seconded by two other members that voted in the majority) the house reconsidered their vote upon the bill, entitled an act for the benefit of the commissioners appointed under, and by virtue of the act passed on the 19th March 1835, chapter 222;

Mr. E. A. Lynch moved to refer said bill to the consideration of the next General Assembly;

Determined in the negative;

Mr. Jones, of Somerset, moved to postpone said bill until the 1st day of June next;

Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Gantt,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany, entitled a supplement to an act passed at Dec. session, 1839, entitled an act in aid of the building of an academy in Frostburg, and a market house and town hall over it, in Cumberland, Allegany county, and the amendments reported thereto, from the committee on lotteries;

The amendments reported by the committee having been read, were assented to,

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

Mr. Dorsey obtained leave to bring in a bill, for the benefit of William Fowler, sen. of Howard District, in Anne Arundel county;

Ordered, That Messrs. Dorsey, Gantt, and Estep, report the same.

On motion of Mr. Paca,

The house took up for consideration, the bill reported by Mr. Ford, entitled an additional supplement to an act passed at December session 1833, chapter 110;

The said bill was then read the second time and passed.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and passed.
