Also the bill, entitled a supplement to an act passed at December session 1839, entitled an act in aid of the building of an academy in Frostburgh, and a market-house, and town-hall over it, in Cumberland, Allegany county;

The bill from the senate, entitled an act supplemental to an act passed at December session 1813, ch. 102, entitled an act relating to sheriffs, and for other purposes; and

The bill, entitled an act to alter and change the place of holding the elections in the 4th election district of Dorchester county,

Were returned to the senate.
