

ble report upon the bill reported by Mr. Wm. Lynch, entitled an act to incorporate the Methodist Episcopal Church in Frederick;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time, by a special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Forman, from the committee on internal improvements, made a favorable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled a supplement to an act passed at December session 1838, ch. 396, entitled an act relating to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal;

Which was read;

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Le Grand, from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled an act for the benefit of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road Company, reported the same with the following amendment:

Amendments proposed.

Strike out section 2d of the bill.

Which was read;

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed with the proposed amendment, and returned to the senate.

Mr. Bowie submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the bill, entitled an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, be postponed and made the special order of the day for to-morrow, at 11 o'clock; and that it be taken up each subsequent day at the same hour, until finally disposed of;

Which was twice read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. Bowie,

He was excused by the house from serving upon the committee of twenty-one, appointed upon the memorial and resolution from the senate, in relation to the memorial of the citizens of Georgetown, and part of Washington county, in the District of Columbia, praying the retrocession of that territory to the State of Maryland, and Mr. Tuck was substituted in his place.

Mr. Billingslea, from the committee on internal improvement, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Joseph E. Muse, of Dorchester county, praying aid from the State in cutting a canal from Transquakin river into Choptank river, in said county.

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time, and concurred in.

Mr. Billingslea, from the same committee, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of C. H. Ohr and others, praying that the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company may be authorised to dispose of a water right therein mentioned;

Which was read the first and by a special order the second time;
